Sarah encourages professionals and parents to explore how we can meet children's needs effectively, communicate with them sensitively, and teach them about their emotions and strategies for regulation from a young age. Sarah has been in the early years sector for over 20 years in a variety of teaching, leadership and training roles. In addition to being a qualified early years teacher and trainer of adults, she holds an MA in Early Childhood Studies and has undertaken postgraduate training in Child, Adolescent and Family Mental Well-being.

<u> Kirsty Davison</u>

Kirsty has over 20 years of experience in working in the early years sector. With specialist expertise in supporting children with speech, language and communication needs. Attention Autism Programme; Two day training course

Description:

This 2 day course equips attendees with the skills to set up and run the 4 Stage Attention Autism programme. The training focuses on the practical aspects of intervention, working in a team and offering an irresistible invitation to learn. The Attention Autism Programme targets the teaching of attention, communication and social interaction skills. Training is run applying the principles of the Attention Autism Programme throughout each day. There are demonstrations of the techniques in action, films of the work with children, practical hands-on experience for participants and ideas for activities. The intention is to share the practical skills needed for participants to feel confident in setting up and running the intervention immediately.

Behaviour and Big Feelings

Number of places:30

All early years practitioners, childminders, managers, SENCos, teachers, teaching assistants, year 1 teachers and leaders.

Description:

This two day course will empower you to respond to children's 'behaviour and big feelings' with confidence. We will explore the connection between behaviour and emotions in a meaningful way, considering:

- Causes and triggers that contribute to a child's dysregulation
- The impact of attachment, SEND and trauma on 'behaviour'
- Communication and teaching styles based in connection and co-regulation
- Effective responses to a variety of dysregulated behaviours including hitting, throwing and biting
- How to use your environment to de-escalate situations
- Activities and resources to help children learn about feelings and how to regulate them
- How to ensure an approach to behaviour and big feelings that is supportive and inclusive of neurodivergent children
- What 'self-control' really means and how to help children develop it

There will be sharing of information, lots of practical tips, and time for reflection and questions. Participants are welcome to bring any questions they may have relating to current 'real-life' challenges.

This collaborative process will not only support the quality assurance of the EYFSP judgements by the end of the school year but will also provide valuable opportunities for ongoing professional development, as schools work together to refine their assessment skills and share best practices.

Description:

Do you want to extend, excite, and enhance practice based professionalism for you and your setting through:

The consolidation and co-construction of a love of learning

The creation and crafting of multiple opportunities for deep level learning

Becoming an advocate for the advancement of autonomy and authentic interactions.

Current research into neuroscience consistently highlights how important quality interactions are for children. But the rhetoric and reality often focus on progress rather than perspective and purpose. Without purpose we know learning doesn't resonate. Ensure the learning in your setting resonate with the children and practitioners. "Operacy" is as important as Literacy and Numeracy, this time for reflection will focus on the pillars of success using scaffolding, self-efficacy and self-regulations the pillars of development. Adopting the strategies provided will enhance all practice and professionalism.

The three days will focus on practice and knowledge. They will positively impact the practitioners at settings as well as parents and children. Through the utilisation of perception, deep level learning, schemas, language (Word Wealth) and neuroscience you will raise the morale of yourself your staff and inspire awe and wonder throughout your setting.

Statutory Progress Check at age 2 and the Integrated Review

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) requirements state that practitioners must review children's progress between the ages of 2–3 years and provide parents with a short written summary of their development in the prime areas.

Health visiting services are also required to complete a Healthy Child Programme development review at 2 to 2 and a half years, working with parents to look at similar areas of development.

In this session we look at how to carry out an effective Statutory 2 year Progress Check, how assessment supports early identification, and how we ensure we provide the right support at the earliest opportunity.

We explore further, how this can be achieved by encouraging parents, early years providers, local authorities, and health visiting services to work together, combining the EYFS Progress check at age 2 and the 2 year Healthy Child development review and discussing how a child's needs can be best met through an "Integrated Review" process.

Stepping into English

'Step into English' was born out of the visible needs that many children had for a new approach to breaking down the barriers to learning which they were facing. Whilst originally put together for children in early years, we have found that the maxim 'stage, not age' is highly pertinent when it comes to intervening in the learning of children of any age. 'Step into English' has proved to be highly successful in helping years 3, 4, 5 and 6 children move from working in small groups within the intervention back into their mainstream classrooms.

- How we might begin to break down these barriers and narrow the gap?
- How we can broaden children's experience in practical ways and build links which bridge cultures?
